



Move On When Ready (MOWR) Program

MOWR gives academically talented high school students the opportunity to earn college credit before graduating from high school. In some cases the high school student may be able to earn high school and college credit at the same time.

Who is eligible? What are the requirements?

- Rising Sophomores, Juniors and Seniors
- Minimum high school academic GPA of 3.0
- Eligible SAT, ACT, Compass or Accuplacer test scores
 - **SAT:** Minimum Critical Reading 430/Math 400 (*if taken prior to March 2016*)
OR
Minimum Reading subscore 24/Math subscore 22 (*if taken after March 2016*)
 - **ACT:** Minimum English 17/Math 17
 - **Compass:** Minimum Reading 74/Writing 60/Algebra 37
 - **AccuPlacer:** Minimum Reading 63/WritePlacer 4/Elementary Algebra 79*. If Reading score is 75 or higher, WritePlacer is not required
*An Algebra score of 79 is required for students who need MATH 1111 (College Algebra) for the Honors Track or if their intended program of study requires College Algebra. An Algebra score of 67 is required *only if* the student does not need College Algebra for the Honors Track and their intended program of study only requires MATH 1001 (Quantitative Reasoning) or MATH 1101 (Mathematical Modeling).
- On track towards the completion of the Required High School Curriculum (RHSC) requirements and high school graduation

What is the MOWR Program?

The Move On When Ready (MOWR) program provides credits for students who are dual-enrolled at a participating eligible public or private high school, or home study program in Georgia, and a participating eligible postsecondary institution in Georgia. These students take postsecondary coursework for credit towards both high school graduation or home study completion and postsecondary requirements. The program is offered during all terms of the school year: fall, spring and summer semester.

Fees

Tuition is covered by the Georgia Student Finance Commission. Through State of Georgia legislation, MOWR students will be provided course books for each course the student is enrolled in per term at no cost to the student. Students taking courses on campus will have the required textbook(s) for his/her course(s) loaned to him/her from the South Georgia State College Bookstore. **The program does not cover course related fees. Students taking a science with a lab will be responsible for a \$25 science lab fee.**
