3-Year Graduation Rate of Student-Athletes

In accordance with the Student Right to Know and Campus Security Act of 1990 (also known as the Clery Act), South Georgia State College provides the following information on graduation rates of the Fall 2021 cohort of Full-Time, First-Time (FTFT), associate degree-seeking student-athletes.¹

Please note that all graduation rates apply to first-time, full-time, undergraduate degree-seeking students and are based on up to 3 years of associate degree program enrollment, equating to 150% of the normal completion time. Graduation rates do not include students who left school to serve in the armed forces, on official church missions, with a foreign aid service from the federal government, or who died or were disabled.

¹ A Full-Time, First-Time (FTFT), associate degree-seeking student, as defined by IPEDS, is an undergraduate student who has no prior postsecondary experience and is attending any institution for the first time at the undergraduate level. The student must be enrolled in 12 or more semester/quarter credits per term and must be formally admitted to and seeking an associate degree. This includes students who began college in the summer term immediately prior to the fall term, as well as those who entered with advanced standing through college credits earned during high school. However, students with any other prior college experience are not considered first-time students.

STUDENTS-ATHLETES RECEIVING ATHLETIC-BASED AID

During the 2021-22 academic year at South Georgia State College, student-athletes received athletic-based aid while pursuing their studies. Among the total undergraduate population of students, the institution distributed \$241,963 in athletic-based aid to support student-athletes. When examining student success metrics, 41.9% of student-athletes completed their programs within 150% of the expected completion time.

KEY FINDINGS

- Overall graduation rate (41.9%) shows successful completion by more than two-fifths of student-athletes
- Women show higher graduation rates (46.2%) compared to men (38.9%)
- Half of the students (50.0%) remain enrolled in pursuing their degrees
- Over half (51.6%) transferred to 4-year institutions
- White students comprise the largest group (62.9%), with a 48.7% graduation rate
- Baseball and Soccer represent over 60% of total student-athletes
